# Year 4—Welcome to Term 4

We are so excited for another great term of teaching and learning at Loganholme State School. Please read through the information below to find out what your child will be learning this term.

### ENGLISH

In English this term, students will read, view and comprehend imaginative texts to engage audiences. They will describe the characteristic features of different text structures, and will describe how language features shape meaning. Students will read the novel, 'The Firework-Maker's Daughter', and analyse characters and key events in the text.

Students will create an engaging imaginative adventure narrative, using the narrative text structure, paragraphs, and language features including complex sentences and literary devices.

### MATHEMATICS

In Mathematics, students will use mathematical modelling to solve financial problems, formulating the problem using number sentences, solving the problem choosing efficient strategies and interpreting results in terms of the situation. They will use their proficiency with addition and multiplication facts to add and subtract, multiply and divide numbers efficiently. Students will follow and create algorithms that generate sets of numbers and identify emerging patterns.

### SCIENCE

In Science this term, students will identify forces acting on objects and describe their effect. They will pose questions and make predictions based on observations. Students will use simple procedures to make accurate formal measurements and they will communicate their ideas and findings for an identified audience and purpose, including using scientific vocabulary.

### HUMANITIES AND SOCIAL SCIENCES (HASS)

In HASS, students will describe the importance and role of local government, community members and laws. Students will develop and propose considered actions or responses.

### HEALTH

In Health this term, students will identify influences that strengthen identities and describe strategies to manage emotions, changes and transitions.

## DANCE

Students will describe use of the elements of dance in dance they experience, create and/or perform. They will describe where, why and/or how dance is choreographed and/or performed across cultures, times, places and/or other contexts.

Students will use the elements of dance to structure dance sequences that communicate ideas, perspectives and/or meaning. They will demonstrate fundamental movement skills and safe dance practice. They will perform their dance in informal settings.

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### **TECHNOLOGIES** – Ms Roser

Students will explore digital systems this semester, including hardware, software, peripheral and storage devices. They will identify inputs and outputs, and plan, design and implement digital solutions applying this knowledge. They will design, modify and follow simple algorithms using MicroBits, involving sequences of steps, branching, and iteration (repetition). They will design, plan, and create a digital solution, and identify how their solution meets student or community needs.

### **PHYSICAL EDUCATION** – Mr Nickson

Students will engage in lessons of volleyball, focusing on the development and refinement of essential skills, including digging, setting, spiking, and serving. These skills are crucial not only for effective gameplay in volleyball but also for understanding and applying strategic concepts that can be transferred to other sports.

### **SPORT** - Mr Haynes

Students will engage in weekly lessons that focus on regulating, managing and monitoring their own emotional responses, and persisting in completing tasks and overcoming obstacles. Students will also focus on communicating effectively, teamwork and collaborating through various games and challenges. Students will learn to show respect for and understand others' perspectives, emotional states and needs. They will learn to participate in positive and respectful relationships, defining and accepting individual and group roles and responsibilities throughout game play.

### MUSIC – Mrs Ingram

Students will be composing, singing and playing instruments using the elements of music such as duration/time (beat and rhythm, tempo, pulse), pitch, dynamics and expression, texture and/or timbre. They will be performing music they have learnt and/or composed in informal settings.
